Introduction: Expecting Great Things from God

Looking Back: What God Has Done

This past year, God has brought us together as a true family.

3. A Life of Prayer

And we have seen Him answer prayers in amazing ways. Sometimes, His answers were unexpected, but we can see now how He has been leading us. Prayer must always be at the center of our church, because without it, we will forget that everything depends on Him.

When the first believers saw God working, they were filled with awe. They knew that what was happening was not because of them, but because of God. Finally, we must **be a church that is available to all**. The early church did not wait for people to come to them—they went out to the community. We need to do the same. That means inviting others, sharing our faith, and making sure that when people do come, they feel welcome and hear the good news of Jesus.
