Salvation - Promised, Fulfilled, Offered, and Glorified

I. Promised from the Beginning

Bible References: Genesis 3:15, Genesis 12:3, Genesis 22:7–14, Isaiah 53:5, Acts 2:23, Ephesians 1:4, 1 Peter 1:20

From the very beginning, God had a plan to save people. In the book of Genesis, right after Adam and Eve sinned, God gave a promise. He said that someone would come who would defeat evil, even though he would suffer. This was the first time God talked about sending Jesus.

IV. Leading to Eternal Glory

Bible References: Romans 8:29–30, Revelation 21:1–4, Philippians 1:6, 1 Peter 1:3–5

The Bible promises that God will finish the work He started in us. He saved us, and He will keep changing us until we are fully like Jesus. This gives us hope even when life is hard.

In the end, those who believe in Jesus will live with God forever. We will be fully healed, fully joyful, and fully safe. This is the final part of God's salvation plan. It shows us that His love never ends.
